

Trinity Participates in Walk to Support Huntington's Disease Treatment and Awareness

On Saturday, September 17th, Trinity staff members came out to support the 14th Annual Kevin Ganley Walk, sponsored by the Huntington's Disease Society of America in partnership with the Lowell Health Care Center.

Held at the Lowell Heritage State Park, the 3.3 mile walk was dedicated to Ganley, a former resident of the center who lost his battle to Huntington's disease at age 33. His family and Lowell Health Care started this walk to increase awareness of this deadly disease.



Huntington's disease is an inherited brain disorder resulting in slow and irreversible loss of both mental and physical capabilities. More than 30,000 people in the U.S. are currently diagnosed with the disease, and their siblings and children have a 50 percent chance of developing it. There is no effective treatment and no cure.

The walk helps fight Huntington's disease by raising funds and building awareness. The walk is designed so all funds raised stay in the local community to benefit research initiatives, clinical-care resources and support services for people and their families affected by Huntington's disease.
